I almost dropped the phone, because I was so emotional. I said to her, "Give me a second, and I will call you back." I dropped to my knees and cried hard, as I spoke with God asking forgiveness for my impatience and lack of faith.

After regaining my composure, I call her back. "Martha, Sorry about that. Did I hear you correctly?" She says, "YES!!" and I tell her the back story. She deposited \$50,000 within 15 minutes of our conversation. I donated \$25,000 and asked all those people to write her a letter, those letters meant more to her than all the money Martha had.
